todays life and the people, with the aid of the Holy Spirit, will determine the application. But it is also my job to stand strong in the truth, and that is the job of every Christian.

"Stand in the truth" Just what does that mean? It doesn't mean using Scripture to attack, it doesn't mean to proclaim ourselves righteous and wear it like a badge. It means when I stand in the pulpit, what I share, what I preach, and teach is an accurate and correct interpretation and application of God's Word, and to show how it applies to today's life. It means I don't twist God's Word, take it out of context to make it mean what it does not.

At the same time the Word must be held above all else; we are God's creation and we are called not to bend to society where it counters what God's Word teaches. There is a fine line to be walked in obedience to God without driving people from the church. The church can't accept society as the drive for any form of morality where it violates what we know to be true.

While I was on active duty the commanding officer of NAS Norfolk called on a Naval instructor to develop a course on morality but demanded the Bible or any other religious source not be used as reference. Some of the old philosophers present moral issues, but they are truly few and weak.

So what are we to do? As I stated earlier every clergy, every teacher, every Christian must be ready to stand for what is right, what is true. If you were an employer and you hired a new employee, would you want someone who will sometimes do the job, or do it half right? I don't think so and God deserves followers with enough backbone to do the job.

The church, meaning every professed Christian, every clergy, every teacher in the church doesn't seem to have the backbone to stand for what we *know* to be right. Who is going to do it, the answer is simple...no one. Morality will be determined by people who are in the "I'm okay, you're okay" club.

I'm not judging anyone else's relationship with God, that is His job and I don't want it. My job is to relate scripture to
