race, gender or any other dividing line, and we certainly don't need multiple anthems, we need a unified anthem.

Imagine for just a second; if one group of people deserves recognition then others do as well. The Spanish speaking, the Italians, Irish, French, the...well you get my point. And what would having all the anthems do? Create division. I was under the impression that a part of the purpose for all of this protesting and rioting was to bring attention to the inequality among the races and to seek equality and unity. What I see is that someone is trying to widen the division between people.

Anyone who knows me even short time is pretty much aware I am a Patriot second only to being a Christian. It breaks my heart to see the kind of division all of this is accomplishing. In fact my fear is that rage will take over and we will be a nation divided. **Matthew 12:25 (ESV)**25 Knowing their thoughts, he said to them, "Every kingdom divided against itself is laid waste, and no city or house divided against itself will stand. Those are warnings from God, out of the mouth of Jesus Christ, how much more proof do we need.

The church has sat on the sidelines for a long time about many issues, it's time we stand up, connect with God's Word and use it as a basis for where we *must* stand. The church's position of standing on the sidelines instead of standing for what is right has got to disappear or the church is no longer the church. What do we do? First pray. Notice I said first pray, that isn't where we stop. We represent God, He left His church here to care for ALL of His people, to do what is right. It's time we take that seriously.

The other day on the news I saw where the Black National Anthem will now be played before the countries National Anthem. Okay, does our National Anthem need to be changed? I don't know, maybe it is time but if it is to change it should be agreed upon by the nation, not one particular
